PAC Update: Actions since the last meeting, and related updates	<p><u>State:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 01/11/23 – NYSPHA signed on to a letter by the American Cancer Society to the governor requesting that she restore funding for the NYS Cancer Services Program. It was not included in Governor’s budget. • 01/11/23 – NYSPHA signed on to a letter by the NYS Rural Health Association to the governor requesting ...Not included in Governor’s budget, still working to get it restored through legislature • 1/19/23 - Kavitha Das, NYSPHA’s NYC PAC chair, represented NYSPHA at a sponsored by the Flavors Hook Kids Coalition to pass the proposed legislation that would restrict the sale of menthol cigarettes in New York City. (see Intro 577 to read the bill). Kavitha attended a city hall meeting with NYC council members, and the group has put out op eds and made other public education efforts, working to get this passed. <p>NYSPHA Climate Workgroup</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Susan Harris joined NYSPHA with the intention of starting a “climate committee” and she is leading the climate workgroup. States “it’s the single most important pervasive public health issue on our horizon right now.” Created mission statement and action plan. • Purpose of the workgroup: education, advocacy, joining with like-minded organizations, taking action (for example, sponsor tree plantings in urban areas), join with businesses-aligning values with investments (there will be an impact assessment webinar March 15- details will be provided) • NYSPHA Policy statement on climate change link: https://nyspha.org/resources/Documents/NYSPHA%20Climate%20Change%20Policy%20Statement%20FINAL.pdf • Kavitha was part of the policy statement development for climate change: Kavitha suggests the people involved in that might join the workgroup and Kavitha would like to join as well. <p>NYSACHO Update</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NYSACHO supports: • Proposed amendment to PH law for public health departments to exempt LHDs from having to meet the same licensing requirements for home visits as non public health home visiting companies • Proposed language to close several loopholes in law that are creating barriers to locally implementing and enforcing the flavored vape ban • Lead poisoning: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Proposed tri-annual inspection for landlords for lead hazards and requirements for abatement. ○ Proposed \$58 million of funding. Some counties have funding but not enough. ○ Proposal for increasing health professions workforce. ○ Carol brought up that there has never been funding to support temporary lead free housing for families while abatement is done. These families are often low income and cannot afford to relocate. ○ President announced in SOTU about lead pipe infrastructure replacement.
